

What Makes the Ocean Salty?

fresh water - characterized by water that is not salty.

evaporation - the slow changing of a liquid into a gas

water vapor - the gas state of water.

Notes from textbook:

- ① Waves pounding on shores pick up salt from rocks and sand, adding more salt to oceans
- ② Volcanoes erupting beneath the oceans add more salt.
- ③ Evaporation occurs on surface of the ocean - water vapor evaporates evaporates (less water in the ocean), but salt stays behind.


From video:

- ④ Water flows down mountains from rain. As it runs downhill, it picks up salt from dirt and rocks. This water leads to the ocean.


